This book is a very substantially altered new edition of *Views from the Weaving Mountain* published by Lee Bartlett in his *American Poetry Book* Series at the University of New Mexico in Albuquerque in 1991.

The following pieces have been taken out. From Section One: "Poetry & Communication," "The World Wide Open," and "Open Letter for an Order of Silence." The whole of Section Two except for "Initiation and the Paradox of Power" and "The Choral Voice," which have been retained in Section Three in order to show something of the relations between my anthropological and poetic thinking. Pieces on Antonin Artaud, on Octavio Paz, and on Translation theory, have been added to Section Two and one, "On Refining a Model of Poetic Production," has been added to Section Three.
